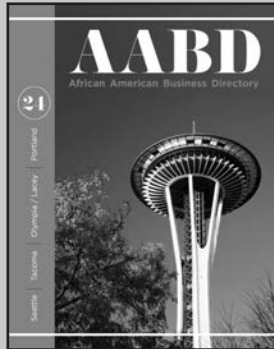

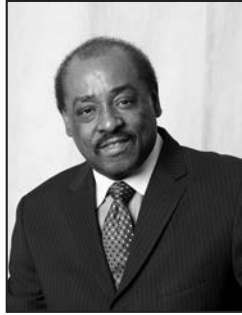

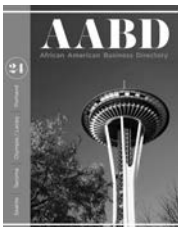
Clean Greens Farm & Market Project

The Black Dollar Days Task Force leased 10 acres of land in Duvall, WA in 2007 in an effort to grow and deliver clean, healthy and fair produce for everyone at reasonable prices. The primary goal is to assist low income people to eat healthy in order to reduce the risk of high blood pressure, high cholesterol and diabetes. Thanks to a partnering with Vulcan, we provide fresh produce in the area.

The market's new residence is at the Walgreens store at the corner of 23rd Ave and Jackson St., Seattle, Wash. It is open every Saturday. A secondary location can be found at Harborview Medical Center, 325 9th Ave., Seattle, WA, on Wednesdays and Fridays. Both operate between the hours 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. from June to October.

In order to reach its goal, the Clean Greens Farm and Market (CGFM) has embarked on a unique Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program in the Central District of Seattle. Community members can subscribe to receive a weekly box of fresh, chemical-free produce. For each subscription purchased, CGFM provides an equivalent box to a family who cannot afford and/or who do not have access to fresh locally grown vegetables

History of Juneteenth

What is Juneteenth? Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration of the ending of slavery. On June 19th, 1865, Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and that all slaves were now free. Note that this was two-and-a-half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, which had become official January 1, 1863. The Emancipation Proclamation had little impact on the Texans due to the minimal number of Union troops available to enforce the new Executive order. However, with the surrender of General Lee in April of 1865, and the arrival of General Granger's regiment, the forces were finally strong enough to influence and overcome the resistance.

Later attempts to explain this two-and-a-half year delay in the receipt of this important news have yielded several versions that have been handed down through the years. One story often told is that of a messenger who was murdered on his way to Texas with the news of freedom. Another is that the slave masters deliberately withheld the news in order to maintain the labor force on the plantations. And still another is that federal troops actually waited for the slave owners to reap the benefits of one last cotton harvest before going to Texas to

enforce the Emancipation Proclamation. All or none could be true. But whatever the reason, conditions in Texas remained status quo well beyond what was statutory.

In the years to come, recounting and celebrating the memories of that great day in June of 1865 would serve as motivation, as well as a release, from the growing pressures former slaves encountered in their new territory. The commemoration of June 19th was coined "Juneteenth" and grew with more participation from descendants. It was a time for reassuring each other, for praying and for gathering remaining family members. The day continued to be highly revered in Texas decades later, with many former slaves and descendants making an annual pilgrimage back to Galveston on this date.

Traditionally, for the Juneteenth festivities, a range of activities were provided to entertain the masses, many of which continue today. Rodeos, fishing, barbecuing and baseball are just a few of the typical Juneteenth activities you may witness today. Juneteenth almost always focuses on education and self-improvement. Thus, guest speakers are often brought in and elders are called upon to recount events of the past. Prayer services are also a major part of these celebrations.

Kwanzaa

Kwanzaa is a unique African American celebration with focus on the traditional African values of family, community responsibility, commerce, and self-improvement. Kwanzaa is neither political nor religious and despite some misconceptions, is not a substitute for Christmas. It is simply a time of reaffirming African-American people, their ancestors and culture. Kwanzaa, which means "first fruits of the harvest" in the African language Kiswahili, has gained tremendous acceptance. Since its founding in 1966 by Dr. Maulana Karenga, Kwanzaa has come to be observed by more than 18 million people worldwide, as reported by the New York Times. When establishing Kwanzaa in 1966, Dr. Karenga included an additional "a" to the end of the spelling to reflect the difference between the African American celebration (kwanzaa) and the Motherland spelling (kwanza).



- Umoja (OO-MO-JAH) Unity stresses the importance of togetherness for the family and the community, which is reflected in the African saying, "I am We," or "I am because We are."
- Kujichagulia (KOO-GEE-CHA-GOO-LEE-YAH) Self-Determination requires that we define our common interests and make decisions that are in the best interest of our family and community.
- Ujima (OO-GEE-MAH) Collective Work and Responsibility reminds us of our obligation to the past, present and future, and that we have a role to play in the community, society, and world.
- Ujamaa (OO-JAH-MAH) Cooperative economics emphasizes our collective economic strength and encourages us to meet common needs through mutual support.

Kwanzaa (Continued)

- Nia (NEE-YAH) Purpose encourages us to look within ourselves and to set personal goals that are beneficial to the community.
- Kuumba (KOO-OOM-BAH) Creativity makes use of our creative energies to build and maintain a strong and vibrant community.
- Imani (EE-MAH-NEE) Faith focuses on honoring the best of our traditions, draws upon the best

in ourselves, and helps us strive for a higher level of life for humankind, by affirming our self-worth and confidence in our ability to succeed and triumph in righteous struggle.

The Kinara holds seven candles to reflect the seven principles which are the foundation of Kwanzaa. The colors of Kwanzaa are black, red and green.

Seattle's African American Artists

JACOB LAWRENCE

Jacob Lawrence is widely recognized as a modern American master and one of the most influential artists of the 20th century. In a career that has spanned over 60 years, from Harlem to Seattle, Lawrence has portrayed scenes of African American history and life in an inimitable style that is distinguished by its bright colors and richly patterned compositions.

ROBERT HORTON

Robert Horton is a Seattle artist who has participated in several public art projects. One in particular is a mural drawing on the diverse traditions of a neighborhood and intended to "celebrate differences...become part of the community [and] market the library commitments to the community."

JAMES WASHINGTON, JR.

James Washington, Jr. is a nationally recognized painter and a sculptor in the Northwest tradition. A contemporary of Morris Graves and Guy Anderson, Washington studied with Mark Tobey. In 1989, the Bellevue Art Museum mounted a retrospective of his work and published a catalogue of the show entitled, "The Spirit in the Stone: The Visionary Art of James W. Washington, Jr." Mr. Washington's residence and studio have been designated City of Seattle Landmarks.



BRENDA JOHNSON

Brenda Johnson is a Seattle artist who draws on her own background to portray scenes of everyday life. Brenda describes her work as "reflecting the importance of family gathering, caring, support and sharing responsibility within each household. I try to

emphasize the importance of social diversity in this society."

JOESAM

JoeSam is an artist whose fanciful and colorful sculptures are reminiscent of folk art and traditions. In one example, the artwork is actually a bench that provides a welcoming seat to the families who are patients at the County's regional health center.



QUINCY JONES

Born in Chicago, Illinois, the oldest son of Sarah Frances discovered music in grade school at Raymond Elementary School on Chicago's South Side where he took up the trumpet. At age 10, his family moved to Bremerton, Washington and he went on to attend Seattle's Garfield High School. The school has since named the new auditorium in his honor the "Quincy Jones Performance Art Center".

In a musical career that has spanned six decades, Quincy Jones has earned his reputation as a renaissance man of American music. Quincy has distinguished himself as a bandleader, a solo artist, a sideman, a songwriter, a producer, an arranger, a film composer, and a record label executive, and outside of music, he's also written books, produced major motion pictures, and helped create television series. A quick look at a few of the artists Quincy has worked with suggests the remarkable diversity of his career, those include names such as Miles Davis, Frank Sinatra, Count Basie, Lesley Gore, Michael Jackson, Peggy Lee, Ray Charles, Paul Simon, and Aretha Franklin.



African American Heritage in King County

The rich legacy that African American residents have contributed to the growth and development of King County has been felt throughout the region for 150 years. Here are the histories of a few of the many people and events that shaped our heritage from the arrival of the first African American settlers through the early 20th century.

Pioneers In the Puget Sound: When the first non-native settlers arrived in the Puget Sound region in the 1850s, African Americans were among the early pioneers. African-born Manuel Lopes was Seattle's first African American settler, arriving in the young town in 1852. Lopes became the community's first barber and had his barber chair shipped by sea from Boston. His shop was just south of what is now known as Pioneer Square Park and Pergola.

William Grose, the city's second black resident (and eventually its wealthiest during the 19th century) arrived in 1861. Grose opened a restaurant and hotel called Our House near today's Pioneer Square. But after the fire of 1889, he moved to his 12-acre ranch northeast of downtown (near today's 24th and Howell streets) and formed the nucleus of one of the city's most important early African American residential districts.

Although many early black settlers purchased land near modern downtown, African Americans like Grose were pioneer developers of outlying districts, too. In 1869, for example, George Riley purchased 12 acres of timberland on Beacon Hill to help develop an early suburban housing tract.

African Americans were an important part of the early business community. However, discrimination in employment limited job possibilities to such positions as manual laborers, porters and maids. As a result, many African Americans began their own businesses.

By the 1890s, these businesses included a number of free-standing enterprises, like Robert and Anna Clark's dairy, and by 1910 there were commercial districts like the series of black-owned businesses on East Madison Street which included a lodging house, a coal business, and a restaurant. Other residents found employment in a variety of fields, from railroad porter and steamship cook to carpenter and newspaper editor.

Horace Cayton arrived in 1889 and established the Seattle Republican, which for 19 years was a leading voice for civil rights and, for a time, the city's second-largest newspaper. As Robert O. Lee, the first African American admitted to the Bar in Washington State, wrote in 1889, some residents chose Seattle because they were seeking a place

"where race prejudice would not interfere with his prosperity."

Building a Community: As the African American community grew, so did local institutions like churches, fraternal lodges, and civic clubs. In fact, two of the oldest churches in the state are houses of worship started by early Seattle African American congregations. The First African Methodist Episcopal Church evolved from a Sunday school that first met in 1886, and Mt. Zion Baptist was founded in members' homes in 1894. Meanwhile, in 1891, William Grose, Dr. Samuel Burdett, and Conrad Rideout established the Grand Lodge of York Masons in Seattle. In March of the following year, lodge members paraded downtown in full regalia, establishing an annual tradition.

Seattle was also a center of arts and entertainment. Jazz had its local roots in Jackson Street in the 1920s and 30s, where several black-owned clubs hosted such musical luminaries as Duke Ellington, Sarah Vaughn, Louis Armstrong, and Lionel Hampton. These stars would join local musicians, often playing Jackson Street after engagements at larger downtown venues. Between the businesses and the entertainment, the neighborhood was sometimes compared to Chicago's State Street or Memphis's Beale Street.

Seattle has long been known as a theater town, and one of the most extraordinary theater endeavors was the vibrant Seattle Negro Federal Theatre, a federally funded project established at the University of Washington in 1936. The company of black actors, singers and dancers featured innovative plays that focused on the African American experience.

Black builders were also at work at the turn of the century. For example, builder Charles Harvey arrived in 1887, and builder E. R. James and his architect son Harry were in practice in the early 20th century.

Obstacles and Opportunities: By 1900, as the city's population grew, various restrictions—both formal and informal—began to hinder opportunities. One example can be seen in the platting of the Mt. Baker residential area in 1900, which included restrictions on people of color. But shortly thereafter, an African American resident, Susie Stone, sued to open the residential tract to all, finally winning in the State Supreme Court in 1911 and building her house in the neighborhood.

Job discrimination, practiced by both unions and employers, was a serious problem. In 1917,

in the midst of the wartime boom, the Negro Business Men’s League of Seattle wrote: “There is a disposition to prevent us from participating in this promised prosperity wave (but)...there are many opportunities in and about Seattle awaiting... including corner grocery stores, shoe repair shops, market stalls, truck gardens, and henneries in the suburbs, berry farms and small dairies in the country as well as other small enterprises.” Indeed, African Americans found employment and created businesses in all these areas. And in 1909, the first black military officer in Seattle arrived at Fort Lawton.

Beyond Seattle: African American settlers lived outside Seattle from the earliest years. African Americans especially played an important role in King County’s early mining industry as well as operating truck farms and berry farms. Here are a few examples:

- **Kent:** The year of statehood, 1889, saw the first African American resident in the small farming town of Kent. William Scott operated a successful truck farm where he raised vegetables for the Seattle markets. In 1890, the region’s first celebration of Juneteenth Day (celebrating the June 19, 1865 order that all workers must be paid for their labors, thus strengthening the earlier Emancipation Proclamation) was held in Kent, drawing celebrants from Tacoma and Seattle.
- **Federal Way:** A Civil War veteran and his wife—John and Mary Conna—were among the first settlers of Federal Way, acquiring a 157-acre homestead in 1885. In 1889, Conna became the first assistant sergeant at arms for the new

Washington State Senate and sergeant at arms in the 1890 special session of the legislature.

- **Coal mining towns:** In 1891, African American miners arrived in the King County coalfields, moving to the site from the South, Midwest, and other parts of Washington. These industrial workers were engaged in one of the region’s most important early industries, and they moved from mine to mine in places like Newcastle, Coal Creek, Ravensdale, and Franklin. The community of black miners numbered more than a thousand by the turn of the century, and their influence was felt in towns like Newcastle and Franklin where African Americans served as school board members, police, jurists, and church leaders. The Colored Baptist Association of Washington was formed at Newcastle in 1900.
- **Bellevue:** At the turn of the century, when Bellevue was a rural community, African Americans from Seattle enjoyed an annual picnic held by the Fraternal Order of the Hawks, a mutual benefit society. Picnickers would board the Leschi ferry in the morning and enjoy a full day of good food, friends and fun.
- **Renton:** African American farmers and miners arrived in Renton in the 1890s. But the population really grew in the 1940s, when the wartime employment boom attracted defense plant workers from throughout the country.
- **Auburn:** Some of the earliest African American residents in Auburn arrived by 1910 and worked in the railroad yards of the community.

NORTHWEST AFRICAN AMERICAN MUSEUM

The Northwest African American Museum is a vibrant community-gathering place, a place where youth, adults and families can honor the past and articulate the future. The



Museum documents and exhibits the unique historical and cultural experiences of African Americans in Seattle and the Pacific Northwest. The Museum is a generative institution capturing history and culture as it occurs, synthesizing what it means for today and tomorrow.

AFRICAN-AMERICAN PATENT HOLDERS

An extensive list of most historical black inventors holding patents, listed by name, patent date and invention with in-depth biographical and technical information on many black inventors and the inventions.

Benjamin Banneker

His inventive spirit would lead him to be called the “first African American inventor”, Banneker invented the first Farmers’ Almanac.

Miriam E. Benjamin

Ms. Benjamin was the second black woman to receive a patent. She received a patent for an invention she called ‘a Gong and Signal Chair for Hotels.’

Bessie Blount

Blount invented a device to help disabled persons eat.

Sarah Boone

The ironing board (U.S. Patent #473,653) was invented by African-American Sarah Boone on December 30, 1887.

Otis Boykin

Boykin invented the ‘Electrical Resistor’ used in computers, radios, television sets and a variety of electronic devices.

Charles Brooks

C. B. Brooks invented the first street sweeper truck and was issued a patent on March 17, 1896.

Henry Brown

Brown patented a ‘receptacle for storing and preserving papers’ on November 2, 1886, which developed into what is now known as the bank safety deposit box

George Washington Carver

Carver invented peanut butter, adhesives, bleach, chili sauce, ink, instant coffee, linoleum, mayonnaise,

paper, plastic, pavement, shaving cream, talcum powder and more.

George Carruthers

Carruthers was the inventor of the far-ultraviolet camera and the spectrograph.

Emmett W. Chappelle

Chappelle was a biochemist, photobiologist, astrochemist and inventor.

John B. Christian

John B. Christian invented and patented new lubricants used in high flying aircraft and NASA space missions.

David Crosthwait

Crosthwait holds 39 patents for heating systems and temperature regulating devices. He is most well known for creating the heating system for New York City’s famous Radio City Music Hall.

Mark Dean

Dean co-invented improvements in computer architecture that allowed IBM compatible PCs to use the same peripheral devices.

Dr. Charles Richard Drew

Drew was the first person to develop the blood bank.

Philip Emeagwali

In 1989, Emeagwali won the Gordon Bell Prize, considered the equivalent of the Nobel Prize, for developing the fastest supercomputer software in the world.

Sarah E. Goode

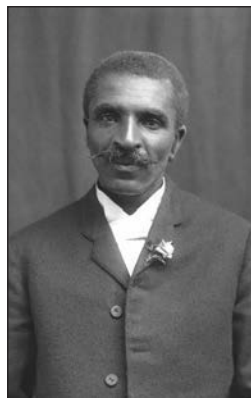
Sarah Goode was the first African-American woman to receive a patent (US #322,177), which was issued on 7/14/1885. She invented a type of cabinet bed.

Meredith C. Gourdine

Gourdine was the inventor of electrogasdynamics systems.

Lloyd Augustus Hall

Lloyd Hall is responsible for the meat curing products, seasonings, emulsions, bakery products, antioxidants, protein hydrolysates and many other products that keep our food fresh and flavorful.



George Washington Carver

Lonnie Johnson

Johnson invented the Super Soaker(r) a squirt gun and also invented thermodynamics systems on the side.

Frederick Jones

Jones invented the first automatic refrigeration system for long-haul trucks.

Marjorie Stewart Joyner

Joyner invented a permanent wave machine that would allow a hairdo to stay set for days.

Percy Lavon Julian

Julian synthesized the medicines physostigmine for glaucoma and cortisone used for rheumatoid arthritis and he invented fire-extinguishing equipment.

Lewis Howard Latimer

Latimer invented the water closet for railroad cars, an electric lamp with an inexpensive carbon filament and a threaded wooden socket for light bulbs.

John Lee Love

The "Love Sharpener" was designed by John Lee Love. Love's invention is the very simple and portable pencil sharpener that many artists use today.

Jan Ernst Matzeliger

Matzeliger invented an automatic method for lasting shoes, which made the mass production of affordable shoes possible.

Elijah McCoy

McCoy is best known for having invented the automatic oil cup. During his life, McCoy invented and sold 57 different kinds of devices and machine parts, including an ironing board and a lawn sprinkler. His first patent was for a lubricator for steam engines (US #129,843), which was issued on July 12th, 1872.

Garrett A. Morgan

Morgan invented the gas mask and the automatic traffic signal.

Norbert Rillieux

Rillieux invented the sugar processing evaporator.

Madame Walker

Madame Walker was a St. Louis washerwoman turned entrepreneur, who in 1905 invented a method to soften and smooth African-American hair.

Granville T. Woods

Woods invented improvements to electric railways, air brakes, telephones and telegraphs; a chicken egg incubator and an apparatus for an amusement park ride.

Black History Month

THE ORIGINS OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH

What we now call Black History Month was originated in 1926 by Carter Godwin Woodson as Negro History Week. The month of February was selected in deference to Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln who were both born in that month.

The son of a slave, Carter G. Woodson was born in New Canton, Virginia on December 19, 1875. He began high school at the age of 20 and then proceeded to study at Berea College, the University of Chicago, the Sorbonne, and Harvard University, where he earned a Ph.D. in 1912.

Carter G. Woodson, however, would be sad to know that out of all the hundreds of Black men and women who produced so many substantial

inventions (from the development of crop rotation, the traffic light, the mail box, gas mask, fountain pen, typewriter, telegraph, golf tee, automatic gear shift, commode toilet to the method of dry cleaning clothes, the electric lamp, and the automatic car coupler and air brake for the railroad) benefiting this country, only four Black inventors have been inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame in Akron, Ohio.

The four black inventors inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame are:

- George Washington Carver - Inducted in 1990
- Percy Lavon Julian - Inducted in 1990
- Mark Dean - Inducted in 1997
- James E. West - Inducted in 1999

How to Start a Small Business

Most entrepreneurs are not adequately prepared to go into business. While they may have the motivation, desire and talent, many do not take the time to properly plan, investigate and research the business they are interested in starting.

Like a chess game, success in small business starts with decisive and correct opening moves. And, although initial mistakes are not fatal, it takes skill, discipline and hard work to regain the advantage.

To increase your chance for success, take the time up front to explore and evaluate your business and personal goals. Then build a comprehensive and well thought out business plan that will help you reach these goals.

The process of developing a business plan will help you think through some important issues that you may not have considered yet. Your plan will become a valuable tool as you set out to raise money for your business. It should also provide milestones to gauge your success.

BUSINESS PLAN

An important step in starting your business is to develop a business plan. The plan will help you define what your business is about, how you are going to market your product, and how your business will operate.

The elements of a business plan include:

- Introduction
- Marketing
- Finance
- Management
- Operations

The Introduction to your business plan should:

- Give a detailed description of the business.
- Explain the type of business.
- Discuss the ownership of the business and its legal structure.
- List the skills and experience you bring to the business.
- Discuss the products and services offered.
- Discuss the advantages over your competitors.

The Marketing section of your business plan should:

- Identify the demand for your product or service.

- Identify your customers and their locations.
- Explain how your product or service will be advertised.
- Explain how your product or service will be delivered.
- Explain your pricing strategy.

The Finance section of your business plan will:

- Explain your source and amount of initial equity capital.
- Develop a monthly operating budget for the first year.
- Provide three years of projected quarterly balance sheets and profit/loss statements.
- Provide monthly cash flow statements for a two-year period that tie to the yearly profit/loss statements.
- Discuss your breakeven point.
- Explain your personal balance sheet and how you will compensate yourself.
- Discuss who will and how you will go about maintaining your accounting records.
- Provide “what if” statements to address any negative situations that may develop.

The Management section of your business plan will:

- Identify the owner/owners and key employees.
- Discuss the skills and experience they bring to the business.

The Operations section of your business plan will:

- Explain how the business will be managed on a day-to-day basis.
- Discuss how you will hire your employees and other personnel procedures.
- Discuss insurance, lease or rent agreements and any other issues pertinent to your business.

Once you have completed writing the business plan, review it with a Small Business Development Center (SBDC) representative or a business associate that you trust. When you feel comfortable with the content and structure, make an appointment to review and discuss it with your banker. The business plan is a flexible document that will change as your business grows.

Washington Voting Information

SIGNING UP TO VOTE

You need to register before you can vote! To sign up to vote, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States.
- A legal resident of Washington State.
- At least 18 years old by Election Day.

In Washington State you do not have to declare political party membership when you register to vote.

HOW TO REGISTER

Simply complete a voter registration form and put it in the mail. Forms are available from your county auditor or elections department, public libraries, schools, and other government offices. You may also request a form through the state Voter Hotline or the Internet. (See information and Assistance in next column.)

Washington's Motor Voter program offers another convenient registration option, allowing you to sign up at the same time you renew or apply for your driver's license.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES

While you may sign up to vote at any time, keep in mind that there are registration deadlines prior to each election. If you miss the deadline, your registration will not take effect until after the election.

- You must be signed up at least 30 days in advance of an election if you register by mail or through Motor Voter.
- You may register in person at the office of your county auditor or elections department up to 15 days before an election.

KEEP YOUR REGISTRATION UP-TO-DATE

If your voter registration record does not contain your current name or address, you may not be able to vote in the next election. You can use the mail-in voter registration form to let election officials know when you move or change your name.

ELECTION DATES AND POLL HOURS

Statewide primaries generally are held on the third Tuesday in September. General elections are held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November. Polling hours for all elections are 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

ABSENTEE/MAIL-IN BALLOTS

Absentee ballot requests must be made to your county auditor or election department. You may request an absentee ballot by phone, fax or mail as early as 45 days before an election. (Absentee ballots are not issued on Election Day except to voters who reside in of a healthcare facility). You may also apply in writing to automatically receive an absentee ballot before each election.

Absentee and mail-in ballots must be signed and postmarked or delivered to the county elections officer on or before Election Day.

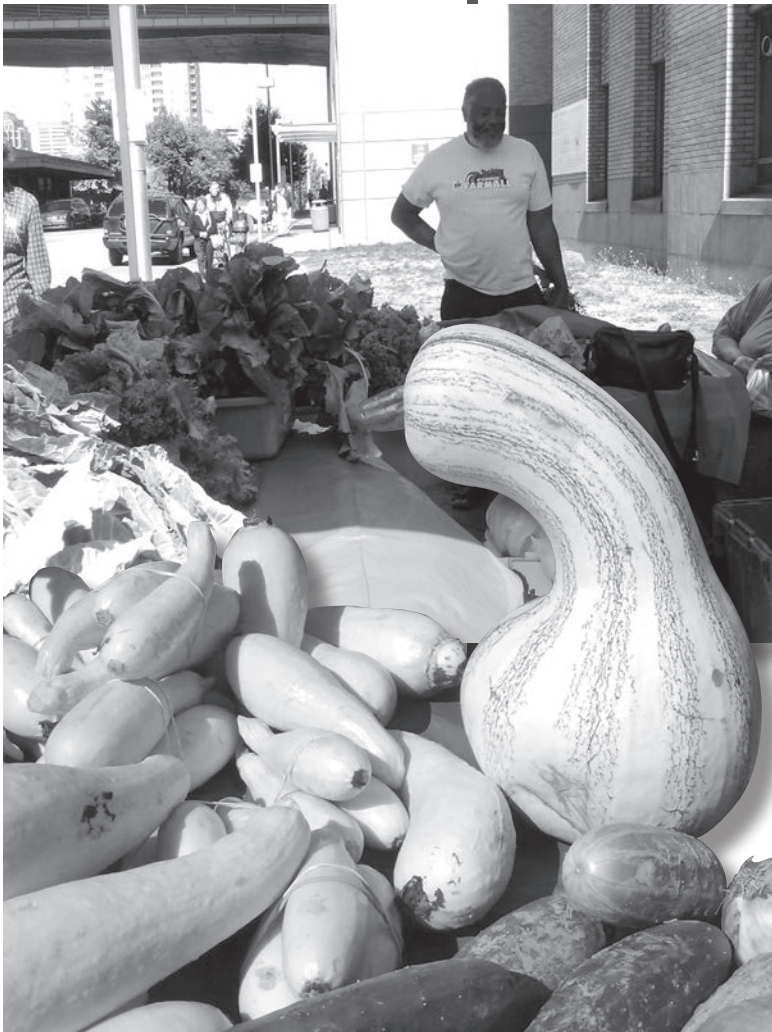

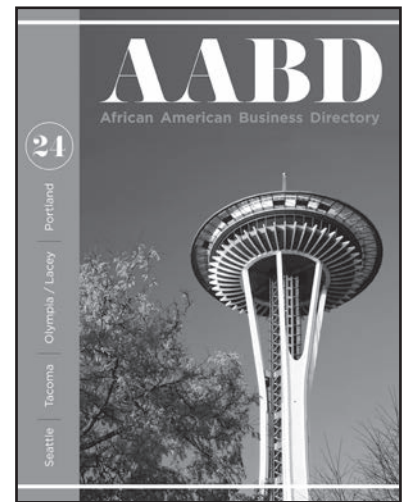
